


Activity 1. Establishing project management capacity, reporting, and visibility

Gender Mainstreaming:

- The project established a gender focal point which is a member of the Mission's Gender Working Group
- Gender Mainstreaming strategy developed implementation and tracking are ongoing
- Significant progress, especially in the National SALW Commission and K9 Unit

- Standard operating procedure and training manual for K9 deployment were developed
- Donation of 14 specialized vehicles and 3 specialized trailers

 An animal welfare expert was engaged to verify the K9 infrastructure's adherence to international best practices on animal treatment

 National and international experts reviewed the regulatory framework of engaging K9 units within law enforcement operations

- A new orientation manual for the National SALW Commission was developed

 A leaflet on the mandatory recertification of legal weapons developed and distributed through local police

 An awareness-raising video for the mandatory recertification of weapons in legal possession was developed and published through social media and television

- Working group meetings on developing a communication strategy for the National SALW Commission were conducted
- Commission logo and social media presence developed

Activity 6. Reduction of illicit firearms through SALW destruction and deactivation

 Study visit to the Republic of Serbia was organized in cooperation with the OSCE Secretariat for the MoIA -Sector on Weapons, Explosives, and Hazardous Materials









Activity 6. Reduction of illicit firearms through SALW destruction and deactivation

 Two vehicles for firearms deactivation inspectors were donated to increase their mobility and enable the transport of specialized equipment







Activity 6. Reduction of illicit firearms through SALW destruction and deactivation

- A working group on developing a standard operating procedure for registration of deactivated firearms was established and is working
- A draft deactivation certificate following EU 2018/337 was developed and is in the approval process







Activity 6. Reduction of illicit firearms through SALW destruction and deactivation

- Procurement of a printer and 6000 sheets of certificate paper with security features for deactivation certificates
- Donation of a PC for operating the deactivated firearms marking machine and printing deactivation certificates
- Donation of one laptop and eight smartphones to enhance internal and external communication in the Sector of Weapons, Explosives, and Hazardous Materials
