

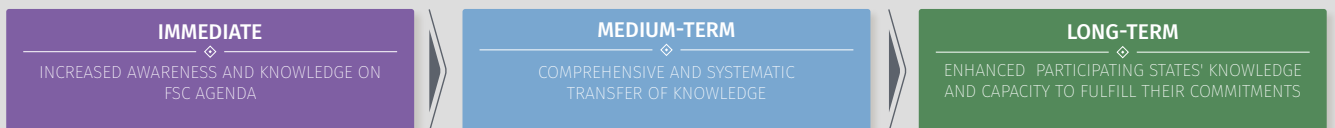
DEVELOPMENT OF FSC E-LEARNING PROGRAMME



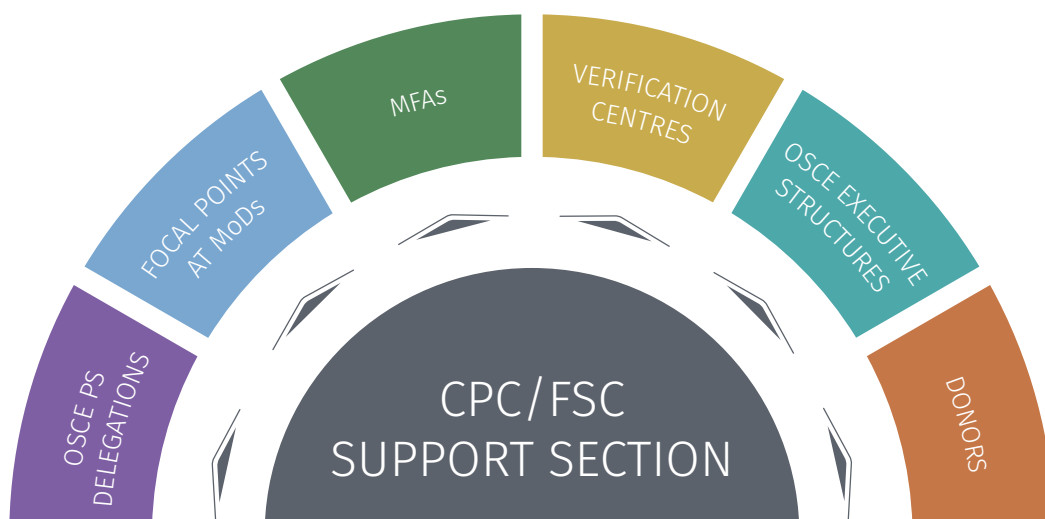
OBJECTIVE: to support the systemization of knowledge transfer to the delegates and national focal points in the capitals of the pS and verification centres about the broad agenda of the FSC.

JUSTIFICATION: Despite the efforts, in recent years the Conflict Prevention Centre has encountered declining support from participating States for multilateral solutions in the field of disarmament and arms control and confidence and security building measures. Separate from a lack of political will, another probable cause could be a lack of expertise, resulting, mainly, from generational changes. Retention of subject-matter experts in the politico-military dimension has also negatively affected participating States’ capacities to fulfil their commitments on practical aspects, for instance, military information exchange. An analysis of existing E-Learning activities within the OSCE shows that there is a lack of training aiming at each subject individually ensuring a systematic transfer of knowledge to the interested pS.
